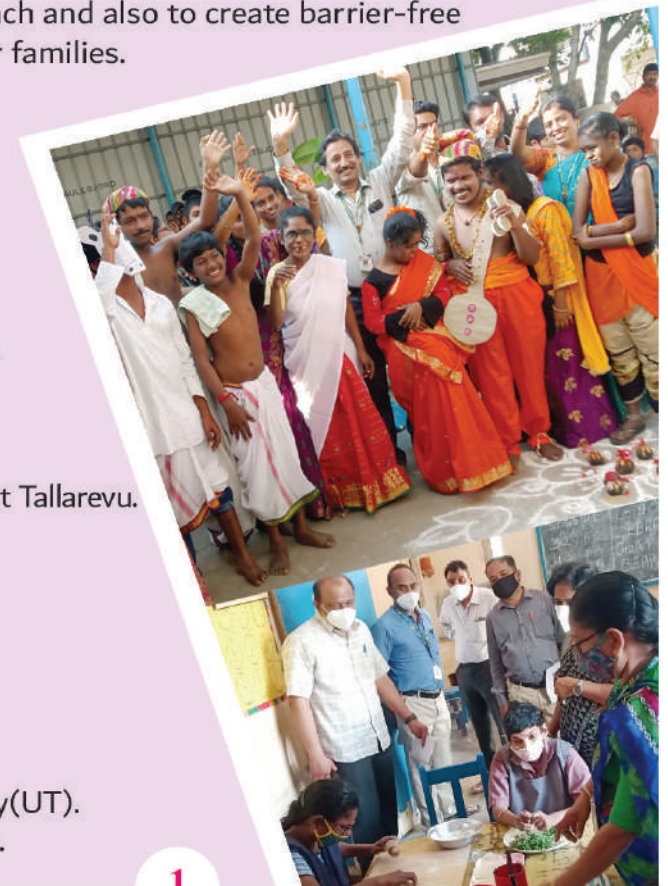
**VISION** | The Persons with different abilities should have equal Rights, Respect and Dignity to lead a better quality of life.

## Covid-19 Vaccination Inclusion Program

Uma Educational & Technical Society, Kakinada organized Awareness and Vaccination of Persons with Disabilities (PwDs) against COVID-19" with an objective to support the vaccination of 1500 persons with disabilities, their caretakers/family members and general public of Tribal area of Rampachodavaram Division with the support of Citrix in Collaboration with Motivation India.

Conducted awareness programmes on Covid-19 and Vaccination to Persons with Disabilities and their families, Fisherman Community and Migrant People at Kakinada Division Rural and Remote uncovered areas through our staff and formed Persons with Disabilities Village groups formed by us with the help of Medical Health Department and 8626 peoples were vaccinated from 29th Nov 2021 to 30th April 2022 with the support of GivelIndia.

### **TLM kits distributed to Children with Special Needs:**

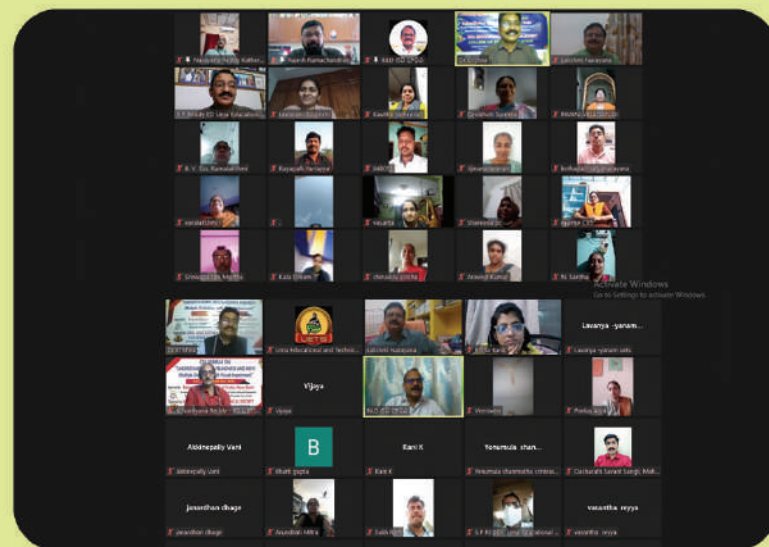

### Special Schools for the Children with Intellectual Disabilities:

Children with Intellectual disabilities are often neglected and looked down upon by the society. They often receive negative feedback from schools and hence refuse to develop positive cognitions to the outside world. As a human being it is their basic right to have equal opportunity for getting education.

Therefore this organization is providing Special Education and Rehabilitation Services to Children with Intellectual Disabilities in the name of Uma Manovikasa Kendram at Kakinada and Ongole of Andhra Pradesh, The Early Intervention & Rehabilitation Centre for Special Needs Children at Yanam, Puducherry under the aegis of Ministry of Social Justice & Empowerment, Department of Empowerment of Persons with Disabilities (Divyangjan), Govt. of India, New Delhi and local resources.

This organization is also maintaining a Day Care Centre for Children with Intellectual Disabilities at Saluru in Parvathipuram Manyam district.

Special education provides students with identified disabilities specialized instruction designed to meet their unique learning needs, giving them an opportunity to develop to their fullest potential. Based on the concepts of these special schools are to provide the following are the services to the beneficiaries at these centers.

## Gharaunda — Group Home for Adults Intellectual Disabled

This scheme aims for setting up Gharaunda Centres are for life long shelter and care of Persons with Disability (PwD) covered under the National Trust Act. Gharaunda Centre should provide minimum facilities. We are providing adequate and quality care services with acceptable living standards to 15 BPL beneficiaries which includes provision of basic Medical care, Vocational activities, pre-vocational activities and assistance for further training. We are also renewing Niramaya Health Insurance every year for the above 15 BPL beneficiaries. As per the Guidelines of the National Trust, we have formed a Local Project Committee (LPC) for effective implementation of the programme.

## Deafblind State Centre — Andhra Pradesh:

We are implementing a Deafblind State centre with the support of Azim Premji Foundation, Bangalore under CSR through Sense International India, Ahmadabad. We are providing various services like identification, screening, clinical and functional assessment (vision and hearing), sensory, mobility, communication and functional academics etc. Also we are providing medical, nutrition and assistive devices, special education and vocational re-

- ☆ 66 Nutrition kits provided to deserving service users.
- ☆ The Deaf blind State Centre has conducted training on deaf blindness to SSA through virtual mode
- ☆ Conducted Volunteers sensitization program through online on 21/02/2022
- ☆ Conducted training on deaf blindness for Asha and Anganwadi workers on 11th June 2021 through virtually.
- ☆ Conducted training on deaf blindness for audiologists on 26th June 2021 through virtually.
- ☆ Organized Network and advocacy program on 23rd Oct 2021 at main center with parents with sense India virtually.
- ☆ Applied 2 students for 10th and 4 students for Intermediate examination through NIOS.





## **District Disability Rehabilitation Centre, (DDRC), East Godavari & West Godavari Districts.**

UETS is an implementing agency for DDRC, East Godavari & West Godavari Districts of Andhra Pradesh which is under Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment, Department of Empowerment of Persons with Disabilities, Govt. of India, New Delhi. This is under the Districts Management Committee which is headed by the District Collector & Magistrate. It is providing several services for the welfare of persons with all categories of Differently Abled.

### **The following are the activities carried out:**

#### **East Godavari District**

- \* 857 PwDs were received various services through DDRC
- \* 290 new Assistive Devices were provided to needy PwDs.
- \* 232 nos. Artificial Limbs / Calipers were repaired.
- \* One amputee camp was conducted by Dr. P. Raghunadh from UK
- \* 145 Dry Ration Kits were Distributed to the Persons with Spinal cord Injured
- \* 5 Screening & Assessment camps were conducted in Coordination with Department for the Welfare of Differently Abled, Transgender and Senior Citizens.

#### **West Godavari District**

- \* 926 PwDs were screened and identified 763 PwDs for Assistive Devices through 5 Screening & Assessment camps conducted at different Mandal Head Quarters.
- \* 564 Assistive Devices were provided to needy identified PwDs.
- \* Conducted 19 Awareness Camps & Training Programmes on Prevention of Disabilities and DDRC activities and the participants are 1617 i.e., IERTs, Anganwadi Workers, ANMs, Parents of PwDs, Asha workers and students.
- \* Conducted Survey in 46 Villages and identified 409 PwDs.





### Workshop (Immovable & Mobile) for fabrication and fitment of Aids & Appliances:

This organization is maintaining a Workshop (Movable & Immovable) for fabrication and fitment of assistive devices to the needy PwDs with the support of Department of Empowerment of PwDs, MSJE, Govt. of India, New Delhi, Philanthropic organizations like GiveIndia, Mumbai, Motivation India, Reliance Industries Limited, Gadimoga, UTI Infrastructure Technology and Service Limited, Sundaram Finance, APEX Frozen Foods Ltd and other Donors. Also we are providing all sorts of Repairs & Maintenance of Assistive Devices through this Mobile Workshop. .

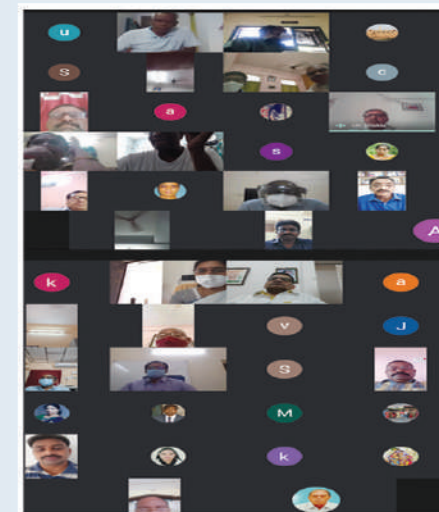

State Nodal Agency Centre (SNAC) is the institutional arrangements of the National Trust at the State/UT levels to support and bring forward its activities. We are the SNAC of Andhra Pradesh. As per the National Trust guidelines we have conducted the following programmes

- \* Organized an Awareness program on Autism on the occasion of World Autism Awareness Day on 2nd April 2021. All the Registered Organizations (RO) have been participated through online.
- \* Celebrated Helen Keller's 141 Birth Day on 27th June 2021 Mr. Navanit Kumar, Deputy Director, National Trust has attended as Chief Guest. All the Registered Organizations (RO) of Andhra Pradesh have participated in this programme through online.
- \* Representatives of Andhra Pradesh National Trust Registered Organizations and NT Scheme Holders have participated in National Convention on Digital Best Practices with emphasis on NE States for Persons with Intellectual & Developmental Disabilities" through Virtual Mode on 20.07.2021.
- \* State Level Coordination Committee (SLCC) was formed on 18th Aug 2021 with the chairmanship of Principal Secretary, Dept., for WCDA & SC., State Commissioner under RPwD Act, 2016 The Director, WDAT & SC, A.P., Vijayawada is as Vice Chairperson, State Nodal Agency Centre for National Trust (SNAC) is as Member Secretary and Local Level Committee one representatives from NGO member of LLC from Chittoor & Srikakulam Districts.
- \* One day orientation training programme conducted on National Trust Activities to the Assistant Directors of all the districts of Andhra Pradesh on 10th Dec 2021 at O/o the Director, Department for Welfare of Differently abled, Transgender & Senior Citizens, Government of Andhra Pradesh.





### Community Based Rehabilitation Project for PWDs at Ramapachodavaram:

Community Based Rehabilitation programme is conducting at Rampachodavaram Mandal which is a hilly and tribal area with the support of Andheri Hilfe Bonn, Germany. It is mainly focused on Health, Education, Livelihood, Social and Empowerment to persons with different abilities and to create awareness on disability, its causes, prevention, schemes, entitlements, advocacy & lobbying, promotion of VDPOs and empowering the differently abled persons.

#### Key Achievements are:

- 76 new PwDs are identified and total 704 PwDs are getting various services.
- 86 PwDs applied through online for SADAREM Disability certificates.
- 395 PwDs are getting social security pension @ Rs. 3000/- per PwD per month.
- 70 CwSN are eligible for Ammavodi scheme of Rs. 15000/- who are regular for school study.
- 28 VDPOs were formed with 285 PwDs. & 130 CwSN & PwDs were benefitted home based intervention
- 650 PwDs were provided provision kits during the Covid-19 pandemic situation.
- 10 PwDs were benefitted individual bathrooms constructed by the Government of A.P.
- 597 PwDs were benefitted through the schemes and entitlements provided by the Government of A.P.
- 147 PwDs could get self-employment under MGNREGS for their livelihood opportunity.
- 22 women PwDs are benefitted who have involved in Women SHGs. & 8 VDPOs have opened bank accounts
- Distributed 30 assistive devices to needy PwDs and 13 CwSN could get TLM through NIEPID
- 1500 PwDs and their families were vaccinated during the Covid-19

### Project for Breaking the Silence for PwMIs and Carers:

Carers worldwide, India has undertaken the current study titled "Promoting access to regular healthcare for 500 persons living with mental illness and transforming the holistic wellbeing of their 500 Carers in East Godavari District, Andhra Pradesh, India in collaboration with Uma Educational and Technical Society (UETS), Kakinada, Andhra Pradesh; National Institute of Mental Health and Neurosciences (NIMHANS), Bengaluru.

This project aims to improve mental wellbeing and promote access to regular healthcare for PwMIs in East Godavari District, A.P., India and to transform the holistic wellbeing of their Carers. We are targeting to reach out PwMIs and their 500 Carers in 10 Mandal's.

#### Key Achievements

- Identified total No. of cases 501 PwMIs and 501 carers (Males-232 & Females-269) in 10 Mandals
- We have consulted the Government General Hospital, Kakinada Psychiatric department for treatment to 115 PwMIs referring to treatment and medication.
- We have organized awareness campaigns on identification of PwMIs, Misconceptions and Stigma about PwMI and their Carers. Mainly we are focusing with the stakeholders ANMs, Asha Workers, Anganwadi Workers, Gram Volunteers and other health related staff. (street play, stalls and magic show)
- Promoted 13 Carer Groups ➤ Conducted three Camps for Carers. ➤ 6 PwMIs could get SADAREM Disability certificates.





## College of Special Education:

Human Resource Development in the field of disability, providing rehabilitation services to the Persons with Disabilities & Rehabilitation. It has been running the following courses which are recognized by Rehabilitation Council of India, New Delhi in association with National Board of Examination in Rehabilitation, NIEPMD, Chennai, AYJNISHD, Mumbai, NIEPVD, Dehradun, Adikavi Nannaya University, Rajamahendravaram and Dr. B.R.Ambedkar Open University, Hyderabad.

Ours is CHILDLINE project as a Collaborative organisation at Yanam under the Mission Vatsalya Scheme (Child Protection Services and Child Welfare Services) with Childline India Foundation (CIF).
